### FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Members,

The Irvington Club, established in 1898, is celebrating its 120th birthday this year and I thought I'd start the festivities by sharing a bit about the club's colorful history. Most of the information in this message is from "The Club That Roared," a history book about the Irvington Club for which we remain grateful for the work of Sarah Thomas and several other members. Although there are no records of who founded the club, its first President was William K. Scott. By the early 1900s, Portland tennis players had only 20 outdoor courts to play on and two of those were at the Irvington Club.

In 1899, the Club had two outdoor courts and a set of bleachers at its first location in the middle of the block between NE Tillamook and Hancock and 19th & 21st avenues. The initiation fee was \$2.50 and monthly dues were just 25 cents. In preparing for the first tournament held at the Irvington Tennis Club in 1899, 15 of the 17 club members divided themselves into four classes according to ability. Walter Goss, who would go on to become Club President and who spearheaded efforts to grow the facilities, was the top-rated player in that tournament.

Amazingly, one year after its founding, the Irvington Club sponsored the very first Oregon State Tennis Championship, which was held on the courts at Multnomah Field (now Providence Park). From 1899 through the 1930s, Irvington Club players dominated the Oregon State Tournament.

In 1905, a group of Irvington Club members, led by Goss, formed the Irvington Improvement Association. In one year, the Association raised \$10,000 through the sale of donations and life memberships. This money was used to buy 12 lots of Block 20 in the Irvington Addition, the block bounded by Thompson, Brazee, and 21st & 22nd avenues. The price was \$9,600, or \$800 per lot. Goss later played a key role in incorporating the club, buying the land leased from the Irvington Improvement Association, and building additions to the clubhouse. By 1912, the Club consisted of six courts and a clubhouse.

In 1929, the Great Depression severely threatened the existence of the Club. With only 30 members, the club officers considered selling everything but the clubhouse, which would have eliminated tennis completely. A small group of members, including Goss, eventually convinced the more pessimistic members to keep the courts.

The Club continued to struggle financially through World War II and began focusing on social activities to attract younger members. In 1957, and still struggling financially, the club examined whether adding a swimming pool might help attract members. It did so and a year later memberships were up dramatically, and the Club established a waiting list!

In the early 1980s, the club began to think about its rich history and realized the need to preserve it. In 1990, the Oregon Tennis Historical Committee was formed. Steve Hall, long time Irvington Club member and a former club president, is the current Chair of the Historical Committee. The committee, as an agent of the Irvington Club, was initiated to collect, prepare and preserve the rich history of tennis in the State of Oregon and to ensure the appropriate contributors to tennis are appropriately recognized.

Among its many accomplishments, the committee, under Hall's direction, has developed a process for securing and indexing tennis history, and Irvington Club history memorabilia in a secure space in the Club. Much of the memorabilia on the walls and in the cases here at the club are indexed and included in the committee's list of collectable items.

In addition, the committee has developed lists including tournament winners, player accomplishments, and the evolution of tennis clubs in the state of Oregon.

The Club has a rich and colorful history, and we are quite lucky to have Steve Hall to help us, and future generations, be able to access this information.

### POOL NEWS




