The first was with T is for Tennis, which Stephanie Vickers has written about in this newsletter. Sounds like it was super fun! - Since we have moved on from the Clay Court proposal, we are resurfacing the outdoor doubles and singles courts. Good news for all you Pickle Ball enthusiasts, I understand that the Singles Court will also have 2 courts of Pickle Ball lines drawn on the court along with the normal tennis lines.
- In the pool, we are wrapping up Phase 2 of the pool update from last summer. We are finishing the fence replacement (we completed the fence next to the tennis court last year). We are also further updating our furniture to provide more shade options, which is needed for those increasingly frequent scorching hot summer days.

And finally, the adidas Open is coming up in June, where we welcome to our club some of the best tennis talent in the region. Because of the hard work that Walter, Cris, and Barb have put into this tournament, and because of members and community organizations that have sponsored the tournament over the years, we are one of the Top 4 professional tournaments in the NW, and participants receive "Top 500 Ranking Points." As a result, we draw top players from around the northwest and country. So get pumped! We've got some great tennis coming to the club this June.

Many of our projects are happening as I type this message. The fencing should be done this week (April 26th). The lobby tables and chairs should be back in the lobby by April 30th. The pool desk will be power washed May 6th, along with the outdoor courts. Immediately following that they will start resurfacing the courts and adding another pickleball court to the singles court! The backboard will have to come down and due to the lack of direct sunlight. The singles court takes longer to cure and then you have to hope not too much tree debris falls on it. We will also cut all of the ivy back on both outdoor courts and will be putting up a new wind screen on the end of the singles court. Our pool heater is at the end of its life so we will be installing a new pool heater. The downstairs men's shower will get some TLC starting April 30th. Most of the new weight room equipment is installed. We are still working on the dual pulley, so more is coming. We have a new piece of equipment (the stair stepper) so if you are not familiar with it, please see Joey and he can show you how it works. Touch up painting on interior and exterior starts April 29th. New pool furniture will arrive and be put out the week of the 13th. Some of these things are weather dependent, so the dates may adjust. We will do out best to keep you informed. I am looking forward to a fantastic summer here at our wonderful Club!

Our adidas Open Tournament is approaching fast and will take place June 18th-23rd, 2019. Last year we had 119 competitors enter the tournament, attracting some of the top collegiate and junior players from around the West. Some colleges represented have included University of Portland, University of Washington, Linfield College, Stanford University, USC, University of Oregon, University of Santa Clara, Gonzaga University and many more! What happens when you mix top collegiate and

junior players with some of the best teaching pros, coaches, and current ATP/WTA touring pros? You get one of the best tournaments of the year! This is the biggest Open prize money tournament in Oregon and the first tournament of the Pacific Northwest Summer Circuit!


The adidas Open has been a staple of the Irvington Club for most of the last century. For many years, it was known as the Portland City Championships. After a hiatus in the 1970's, Cascade Athletic Club revived it in 1986 and renamed it the Rose Festival Open. In 2001, this tournament returned to its roots here at The Irvington Club. Some of the best players to ever play on these courts have been crowned champions including Emery Neal, Sam Lee, Elwood Cooke, Hedy Jackson, Stella Fording, Brian Parrott, Brian Joelson, Brett Joelson, Mike Tammen, Travis Parrott (2009 US Open Mixed Doubles Champion), Oren Montevassel, Angelo Niculescu, Roman Borvanov, Carolyn Lumber, Kelci McKenna, Suzanne Matzenauer, Samantha Hampton, Malika Rose, just to name a few! Many of our players have also toured professionally and earned ATP & WTA Tour points, including our defending Men's Champion Mike Pervolarakis and Women's Champion Cali Jankowski.

During the 6-day tournament, we schedule action-packed tennis matches. On the opening night, we will have a Pro Am where certain sponsors will have the opportunity to play with some of the top players in the tournament. Throughout the tournament, our sponsors receive complimentary beverages and snacks. We will also have a dinner on the Saturday evening of the tournament.

USTA National Men's 60 Hard Court Championship


This year's National Hard Court Championship was held at the beautiful Mission Hills Country Club in Palm Desert, California.
