Portland Backpack: Communities caring for kids

Portland Back Pack Project needs us in August

The Community Involvement Committee invites the Irvington Club to partner with the Portland Back Pack Project, a volunteer project that helps to eliminate food insecurity for Portland children in four in NE Portland Schools (Kind, Rigler, Scott and Woodlawn). For many children, free school meals are their only reliable food each day. On the weekends these children often don't have the food that they need.

Last year 11,110 food-sacks were distributed to kids. That means that 11,110 times a child had enough food for the weekend! Volunteers made this possible!

A story worth sharing is from last year about four children from one family receiving the food sacks. The school found out that for many weeks the food the kids were taking home each weekend had been the ONLY food in the house all week long. The parent had been in a dysfunctional state so the school stepped in and helped them get some additional help. This is a clear example of why it's important to put the food directly into the kids' hands.

*These are the specific foods requested for the backpacks:

Protein: Progresso soup- low salt, Amy's soup, canned chicken, ravioli, Mac & Cheese - No ramen noodles or condensed soup.

Fruit: Any canned fruit or fruit cups. Light syrup or no added sugar.

Oatmeal: Single serving- Instant oatmeal packages - Any flavor.

Snacks: Granola bars, small boxes of raisins, - Avoid peanuts, and snacks with high sugar.

Food lists will be available at front desk to take to the store.

FOOD COLLECTION will be all through August ~ There will be boxes in the lobby to collect donated food, or if you prefer to make a monetary donation, we will have an envelope at the desk to deposit your cash. At the end of the food drive, we will go to COSTCO to buy items needed for the packs.

PACKING PARTY on Wednesday, September 11 in the Ballroom from 6-8PM.

In addition to providing the food volunteers are encouraged to compose and write Care Cards: Adults and kids can write and decorate a note of encouragement and caring to be tucked into each food-sack.

Next time you see Kevin or Brian, give them a warm thank you for their commitment to the Irvington Club.



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
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
