Irvington Club Volunteer Interview: Cindy Trelstad

I was fortunate to sit down with Cindy Trelstad in her home to talk about her spirit of volunteerism. She is a shining example for us all. Cindy has been a volunteer as long as she can remember - whether it was caring for younger siblings in her large family, or taking in exchange students, hockey players, or neighbors from across the street. Recreating that sense of belonging in a community has been very important to her. So many are lucky to be touched by her generous energy.

There is a stream of opportunities that Cindy has been involved in over the years. Many a parent in the neighborhood can thank her for being one of the first teachers to help Founder Carol Hazzard (ITC Member) get Hancock Street Preschool started. She has been involved with Camp UKANDU (Children's Oncology Camp), Kids on the Block (comedy and storytelling while puppeteering), Urban Tour Group (teaching kids the history of downtown Portland), and the Children's Relief Nursery (holding babies) dating back to the 1980's. At least that's the formal list. I am sure there were informal moments of time and energy she gave over the many years of parenting, being a schoolteacher, and active member of ITC and NEP.

Cindy has been on many an adventure traversing thousands of miles across the country between being a green horn from Salem, OR to Columbia University in NYC, to Teaneck, NJ, and Portland, Maine and back. She worked as a teacher as her husband Don went through Medical School and Residency before returning to Portland to practice Cardiology and create a home. They have raised their two children and been members of The Irvington Club for over 35 years. Their kids took swim lessons at ITC and Cindy has been an avid tennis player. She served on the Board about 25 years ago and noted many accomplishments from that term: hiring Barb Farmer and Cris Valverde, enhancing communication at Board meetings, and initiating the discussion of an upstairs enclosed board room for meetings and display of the Irvington Historical Tennis Society memorabilia. Wow. Thank you!

I asked Cindy what advice she would give others interested in volunteering. "Follow your heart and do what you do best. Others inspire us, so get out there and be the best you can be". Cindy has used this philosophy to guide her over the years – she knows she is goofy and silly - and others see it as an extraordinary gift. So much so that she was asked to be the Director of Camp UKANDU during its early years when getting up and going. She was asked to be goofy, create fun, show up, and be silly. She did this as an Art Teacher at an early one-day Saturday camp while putting her teaching skills to best use, set the tone when asked to be the Director, and now energetically greets kids entering camp to provide a welcoming, happy arrival. She volunteers not only at the Camp Collins site, but year-round chipping in to create projects for camp. Her specialty is helping kids have fun away from chemo treatments, hospital visits, and the limitations and challenges from cancer. Her joyful, giving, and self-less nature encourages others to see the bright side of things. She helps kids, parents, and siblings with distraction, so they can just focus on the freedom and pleasures of summer camp.

Cindy's extraordinary talents and infectious spirit have motivated others including 3 siblings who still work at the camp today, returning campers who have become counselors, and who knows who else, maybe even you one day. Cindy believes in the values she learned in a big family as the 3rd of 7 kids. She also sees the Irvington Community as one big Family, there to support each other. Tennis has been her outlet while the club has been rooted in balancing life. Cindy is extraordinary alright, appreciating family and friends, having fun, being silly, and creating joy by using her talents. Thank you, Cindy, for all your efforts throughout the years at the Irvington Club and greater community. The inspiration you provide to others and the laughter you share brightens our day.


