

Where are they now: Randy King

About a month ago, out of the blue, we received a packet of information from Randy King. Randy's parents, Harvey and Kim, were members of the Irvington Club back in the 1960's and 70's. Randy was an exceptional junior player having won the Oregon High School State Singles Championships for Wilson High School in 1966 and 1968. Randy had offers to play tennis at Stanford but chose to go to USC. After college, he moved to the East coast, and then on to China. We would occasionally hear that he was still involved with tennis but had no idea of the extent until we received the material from him which included the brochure announcing that he had recently been inducted into the Hong Kong Tennis Association Hall of Fame. The following are some of his accomplishments:

- Prior to arriving in Hong Kong, he was an ATP ranking player in both open singles and doubles.
- Competed in the men's doubles main draw at the U.S. Open in 1977
- Won the Hong Kong Invitational Men's Singles title in addition to three singles and two doubles titles at the US Men's Chinese National Championships in the 1970's


• Represented Hong Kong in 5 Davis Cup ties, going 0-2 in singles and 3-2 in doubles Since we don't have a great deal of documentation concerning tennis in Portland in the 1960's, I asked Randy if he would be willing to describe what it was like playing tennis in Portland in the 1960's. He provided me some information which I put in a report form that describes: playing at the Irvington Club, Junior Tennis, Tournaments, and tennis players and coaches. The report is available for viewing on the Irvington Club Bulletin Board. I can also provide a copy of the report by email upon request.

The first picture below shows Randy and his coach Ed Leonard after winning the US Chinese National Doubles Championships in 1973. Ed was Randy's coach while in Portland and was the club pro when I joined the club in 1970.

The second picture is taken after he and his doubles partner Bjorn Borg defeated Mark Cox and Paul MacNamee in the ATP Seniors tournament in Hong Kong in 1996. The other person in the picture is Harvey King, Randy's father.

It's been amazing having the kids back at the club this week and we are now reminding them to begin challenging each other on the Tennis Rungs app to get that much needed match practice in before our tournament begins. For our tennis ladders, please visit <u>Tennis Ladders – THE IRVINGTON CLUB</u> (irvingtonclub.com/tennis-ladders) for more information. We will be looking at how the kids are doing on the club tennis ladders to help assist us in seeding the different junior class draws.

At this time please mark your calendars for this event and register on the tournament homepage by <u>clicking here</u> (playtennis.usta.com/irvingtonclub/Tournaments/ Overview/DF02A291-C476-472B-B281-789613B1F30A). If your child is participating on the tennis ladders, having some match play and scoring experience is mandatory to participate in this tournament. You will notice events beginning with U12 and up through U18 for boys and girls with singles and doubles. If your child is, for example, nine but plays on the tennis ladder then please register for U12. We will adjust the age events to match the different junior class names like Futures, Power and High School, and create coed draws where necessary. All-important tournament information will be on the tournament homepage where you will visit to see all seeding, draws and schedules of when your child is scheduled to play.

It is mandatory to register for **free** on the Match Tennis App before April 20th in order to compete. *Be sure to register for this directly on the tournament homepage as it's linked to the junior tournament.* We recommend just doing it after you register for your events on the site so you are all organized and ready to go. To understand this app better you may <u>click here</u> (matchtennisapp.com) for all the information on it. This Match Tennis App is essentially our new virtual tournament desk and organizer for all our tournaments this year. You will also be able to report your match scores without reporting scores at the tournament desk. Get familiar with this app, because we will be using it with all our tournaments and calendars as well as excellent communication abilities for The Pros to use when communicating with you all during the tournaments. This app will help us safely manage the tournaments during the pandemic.

So, register now and begin challenging on the Tennis Rungs app! See you at the club.


