Walter's Wisdom

When your partner is serving, be sure to stay active at the net by following the ball as it moves toward the service box. If the serve goes up the T, move toward the middle to try and intercept the ball. If the ball goes into the middle of the service box into the returner's body go straight ahead of you and lastly, if the ball goes out wide follow the ball toward your alley. By moving like this toward the net you are putting yourself in the way of the returner's reply ball and giving yourself a chance to intercept the ball. In doubles we call this poaching the ball.

This movement tactic takes a lot of pressure off the server, because the server doesn't have to always make the second ball from the middle of the court or feel the pressure of always hitting the returner's next ball. This active movement at the net also makes things a whole lot more difficult for the returner to hit the ball past you at the net as it's distracting for the returner when you are moving back and forth.

Next time you are playing doubles, be more active at the net and try to intercept the return. Your serving partner will thank you for it.


