We invite those who are interested to join us upstairs in the lounge to discuss **<u>The Sum of Us** *What Racism Costs Everyone and How We Can Prosper Together* by Heather McGhee.</u>

The book is an analysis of how we are divided and self-destructing, materially rich but spiritually starved and vastly unequal. McGhee, a descendant of enslaved people, is very much concerned with the situation of Black Americans, making clear that the primary victims of racism are the people of color who are subjected to it. <u>The Sum of Us</u> is predicated on the idea that little will change until white people realize what racism has cost them too.

We teach both adults and juniors this simple, but powerful rule when competing. Tennis is a unique sport, because we don't have an umpire or official on the court during our matches. Unless of course you are playing in a Sectional, National or Professional tournament. We have to make our own calls. This works well when both opponents give each other the benefit of the doubt and only call balls out when they are 100% sure, and it quickly becomes contentious when one player doesn't follow this rule. It takes practice to be selfless. Next time you play a match, concentrate on being a good line caller and more often than not you will have more positive match experiences.
