President's Message

Dear Irvington Club Members,

Wow! What a great tournament we have had so far! Great tennis, warm camaraderie, tasty food, FUN! Thanks to every one of you who has contributed to all that.

Our interim manager, John Thomas, will not be with us long (last day will be Nov. 19). Yet in his abbreviated time he is proving himself to be extremely valuable to our Club. Please take time to introduce yourself to him and help make him feel welcome and appreciated.

In my October message I promised to give you more detail about the findings of the recently completed renovation survey. Over 350 members filled out the survey. Here is how they identify priorities:

- 1. The pool-house bathrooms, lockers, and showers need renovation.
- 2. The north singles court is valuable real estate that is underused. Enclosing it would give us another fun, multi-purpose space. Two lined pickleball courts could fit in the enclosed space.
- 3. The ballroom needs an upgrade with acoustic improvements, fresh finishes, and a technology upgrade.
- 4. The basement locker-rooms and junior lounge need to be reconfigured (people mostly do not like to go down there).
- 5. Members are not particularly familiar with the apartment so thoughts on its use were sparse. There were many comments, however, about using it to benefit members more directly.

The weight room was not included in the survey. Nevertheless, many members commented on it and said it is another area that needs updating.

Please understand that these are the priorities identified by the members who filled out the survey. While this is valuable information for making decisions, it does not necessarily mean that we will pursue projects in this order or even be able to tackle them all. The next step for the larger capital improvement projects is to get budgetary cost estimates on different options.

Because the ballroom and weight room upgrades are smaller capital improvement projects, the Renovation Committee is in the process of producing recommendations to the Board of Trustees to upgrade those spaces sooner rather than later.

Ed Vranizan, chair of the Renovation Committee, is planning to hold informational sessions for members in early December to present possibilities to you. Exciting times! In service,
